The golden hours - managing new born lambs

Problem

High mortality rates in newborn lambs

Reasons

Viruses, bacteria and protozoa can cause diseases such as watery mouth, coccidiosis and tetanus.

New born lambs are at risk of hypothermia if their body temperature is not maintained.

New born lambs must receive adequate colostrum and nutrition in order to survive.

Prevention

Our top tips to help give your lambs the best start...

Make sure the lamb can be identified with its mother and is well bonded

Check the lamb is dru

Treat the navel cord within 15 of birth

Check the lamb has suckled and ingested sufficient colostrum

Check the ewe has an adequate milk supply

Avoid unnecessary interference

good hygiene



Colostrum - feed it as soon as you can!


within the first 6 hours if possible

Lambs are born with no antibodies to protect them against disease...












